

Ancient, Indus Valley Civilization, (c. 2500-1900 BC), **Gold Ornament-Diskette Shaped with a Hole at Center for Stringing**, 0.89 gms, 11.05 mm, A hoard of such diskettes was found in June 2000 in a copper urn at Mandi in Muzaffarnagar district, a place about 200 km north-east of Delhi. This hoard is hence popularly known as the Mandi treasure. The hoard included varieties of beads, bead joints, spacer beadsand thin circular diskettes, similar to the one listed here. 10. **Ancient**, **Ayodhya**, **Gomati-Ghaghara River Valley** (c. 6th-5th Century BC), **Silver PMC**, 5.12 gms, 14.43x27.64 mm, Obverse: Central/Main punches of 'three loops around a central blob' and 'wheel', Reverse: Uniface, **References # Hardaker**, **Non-Imperial Series**, **AY 2**, **pg. 115**, **Rajgor**, **Series # 82**, pg. 186, very fine for the type, extremely rare.

This coinage was first known from a hoard of 50 coins, found in 1930s from a village in **Ayodhya (U.P.)**. The hoard was purchased by Lucknow Museum. Later, some pieces were acquired by Bharat Kala Bhavan, Varanasi. The coins are very archaic, hot-struck, based on a single (no fractions known) heavy weight system and have two symbols (the 2nd symbol being smaller in size). This coinage has been tentatively associated with Ikshavaku dynasty of Ayodhya. This coinage is probably the earliest coinage of India (Lahiri − 1973). This series was a very short lived one and is therefore, one of the rarest in the entire punch marked series. The archaic manufacturing technique (which is un-matched with any contemporary series of punch marked coins) vouches for its antiquity.

The Mallas were among the 16 prominent Janapadas of India as per AnguttaraNikaya. Two branches of these people were settled in Pava and Kusinara respectively. These were contemporary to Buddha and claimed/received a portion of Buddha's ashes after his funeral and upon which, a stupa was erected by them. The area of the Mallas was in present day Deoria/Kushinagar/Gorakhpur districts of U.P. Extensive remains pertaining to the Mallas have been un-earthed in Kasia (Kushinagar) near Gorakhpur.

These exceedingly rare PMCs have been found in Narhan hoard (near Gola Bazar) and in another hoard from Gorakhpur. This series is one of the rarest and historically most important (due to their contemporeinity/ association with Buddha) series in the entire punch mark series. It may be pertinent to mention that 2 gm approx. coins (# Rajgor Series 72, Pg 170), which are often encountered in trade in name of "Malla", actually belong to the Pauravas of Kaushambi (Mitchiner – 2004, Hardaker – 2019) and not to the Mallas. The coins attributed to Malla are all near 5.0 – 5.5 gm wt standard (# Rajgor Series 70) or their half at around 2.6 – 2.8 gm. wt standard (# Rajgor Series 71). Present coin is a full unit of 4.98 gm. of Rajgor's Series 70 (Pg. 168) and belongs to the Mallas.

Vanga was an ancient janapada of high antiquity. As per Rajgor (Pg. 29), the Vanga janapada is mentioned in Aitareya Aranyak, Baudhayana Dharmasutra, Panini's Ashtadhyayi, the Bhagvata Purana and the Kavyamimansha. Going by the Magadhan Six-armed symbol and Sun symbol on this PMC series, Hardaker opines that these were perhaps issued by the Mahasthangarhregion as a vassal of the Magadhan state, which might have annexed the Vanga territory in course of its imperial expansion. Further, going by the proto-type Six-arm symbol, he suggests the time period of this series to overlap with the early expansion phase of Magadhan state i.emid 4th century BC. However, it is pertinent to mention that around 2.0 gm., this series may hardly be associated with Karshapana weight standard (as claimed in various publications viz. # Hardaker − 2019 Pg.256, # Rajgor Series 5, Pg. 31). This coinage, in all likelihood pertains to a period when the coinage of 4.00 gm. wt std. (e.g. various issues of Kosala) and 2.00 gm. wt std. (e.g. issues of the Pauravas of Kaushambi) were being issued and hence, the coinage under reference, though having Magadhan influence, might be earlier that 4th century BC.

Their coins, alongwiththose of Kunindas have been found with a very short lived series of a local monarchial dynasty of Bhanuva, Bhanusharma, Bhanughosha and Ravana in Lansdowne and Chakkar hoards.

As a result of his incompetence he left all the work of administration in the hands of his minister, Hamid Khan, and himself began to live in Badaun. Gradually, Hamid Khan captured all the powers of the Sultanate and became so impertinent that he started ignoring the Sultan. The Sultan conspired against Hamid Khan in order to get rid of him but did not succeed. On the contrary, Hamid Khan invited Bahiol Lodi, Governor of Multan, to invade Delhi. Bahlol Lodi was already looking for such an opportunity. He immediately marched against Delhi and captured power. Hamid Khan was expecting that he would make Bahlol Lodi his puppet but he proved too powerful to bow down before his ambitions. Hamid Khan was imprisoned and killed later. Bahlol Lodi invited Alauddin Alam Shah to get his throne back but he refused politely. He continued to live in Badaun till his death in A.D. 1476. He said to Bahlol, "Since my father called you his son and I have no anxiety for the provision of my few wants, I am content with one Pargana of Badaun and am giving up the empire to you." Type, AH 945, The earlierst silver rupee issue, introduced by Sher Shah Suri in 1540 AD, marked the earliest standardized currency in India. Weighing 178 grains of silver, it replaced the earlier tanka. The coin featured legends within a square border on both sides one side displaying the ruler's name and titles, the other often a Persian legend. This reform laid the foundation for future Indian coinage, influencing the Mughal and later currency systems, and contributed to the economic stability of Sher Shah's empire. The Battle of Chausa, fought on June 26, 1539 AD, was a decisive confrontation in which Sher Shah Suri emerged victorious over the Mughal Emperor Humayun. The battle took place near Chausa, approximately 10 miles southwest of Buxar in present-day Bihar, India. In a crushing defeat, Sher Shah's forces routed the Mughal army, compelling Humayun to flee for his life. In his desperate attempt to escape, Humayun famously plunged into the Ganges River. This victory significantly enhanced Sher Shah's standing, both militarily and politically, and led to his proclamation as Sultan, adopting the title Sher Shah. His triumph at Chausa not only marked a turning point in the Mughal-Suri conflict but also solidified Sher Shah's authority, paving the way for his subsequent reforms and rule, which would have a lasting impact on the governance of northern India, G&G # D816 die variant, very fine, very rare.





Famine Relief Grain Token, 1 Rupee, Gold Gilt, 5.02 gms, 25.28 mm, 1874 AD, This rare Bengal Famine Grain Token from 1874 AD is a historically significant piece, issued during the devastating Bengal Famine (also known as the Bihar Famine) of 1873–1874.
