The earlier (right) side clearly shows a 4 symbol design (ABCC pattern) of a Bargama hoard type coin. Bargama hoard was found in Distt. Shahdol of MP (published by me in Numismatic Digest) and the coins of that hoard were attributed to Chedi mahajanapada. It is a historical fact that Vatsa was overrun by Kosala, which in turn was won over by Magadha at a later date. Representation of symbols of two mahajanapadas on a single coin, clearly indicates some political turmoil during the period, thus making this coin, which is even otherwise a highly pleasing coin, having all four punches well spaced and clearly punched with full impression, an incredible piece of history of that period, Rajgor Series # 78, very fine, very rare.

13. Ancient, Archaic Series, Punch Marked Coinage, attributed to Kosala Mahajanapada (C. 525-465 BC), Silver Karshapana, 2.12 gms, 15.14 mm, Earliest Phase Coin. Vimashatika Weight standard. Kosala was counted among the maha (great) janapadas (kingdoms) (out of 16 janapadas, listed in Anguttara Mahanikaya). In its earliest phase, it was divided into two parts, Uttar Kosala (capital Sravasti) and Dakshina Kosala (capital Kushavati). During the times of Buddha, it was a most prominent mahajanapada with Ayodhya as capital. This was constantly at war with neighbouring states of Kashi and Magadha. It annexed Kashi in very early phase of that period (thus explaining scarcity of coinage of Kashi). During that period, all the three great Mahajanapadas (Kashi, Kosala, Magadha) were issuing their coins on Vimashatika weight standard. Present coin belongs to that phase. These coins are known only from a small hoard, found from Jais (Distt. – Rai Bareilly) in 1990-91. Most of the coins found in that hoard were full unit 4 symbol coins. Only a very few single symbol coins were reported from that hoard and known so far. This particular human face type symbol is known for the first time in this exceedingly rare series, very fine, rare.

Present coin is half denomination. This is a single symbol coin, depicting a turtle on obverse and a bankers' mark on reverse. This series has been attributed to the Pauravas of Kaushambi. As per Puranas, on account of heavy floods in Hastinapur, a line of descendants of Pandavas and Kauravas (what was left of them after the famous Mahabharat war) left Hastinapur and migrated towards Kaushambi around 800 BC and settled there. Present issue is attributed to them. Pauravas were a smaller group of people (not finding mention in the list of 16 janapadas in Anguttara Nikaya) but were in existence during the times of Buddha, on account of which and due to use of an earlier weight standard, these coins are said to have been in circulation till a period when Magadha was spreading its empire but was yet to conquer the central/western parts of modern Uttar Pradesh. Thus the period during which this series might have been in circulation should not have lasted later than 380 BC to 360 BC, Mitchiner pp.810 - 813 and Hardaker pp. 109 - 113, very fine, very rare.
